- Heart Failure is the **leading cause of hospitalization** for the elderly in Canada⁵
- **Heart Failure patients generally stay longer in hospital**, contributing significantly to Alternative Level of Care (ALC) days²
- Heart failure costs the healthcare system over **\$2.8 billion per year**¹
- Five years after a heart failure diagnosis, **less than 40% of patients are still alive**⁶⁻⁷



How does Heart Failure increase likelihood of falls:

- Fluid buildup in the lower extremities
- Shortness of breath may result in breathlessness & dizziness
- Extreme levels of fatigue may lead to decreased attentiveness, poor footing & loss of balance
- Nocturia – taking diuretic medication
- Certain medications
